



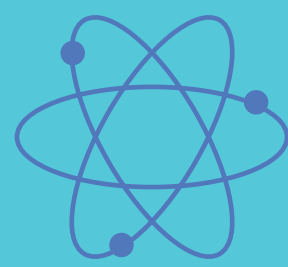
Materials donated by local businesses and manufacturers are available for reuse by teachers, artists and community programs.

Field Trips to the S.C.R.A.P. Gallery

The K-12 waste prevention education field trips are held at the Gallery located on the Riverside County Fairgrounds. Each field trip includes a 15-40 minute environmental presentation and a 45-minute self-directed art workshop using recycled and reused materials from the S.C.R.A.P. Gallery Warehouse. The time and content of scheduled presentations vary according to age and grade. A hands-on setting is an important component of education presentations as it provides concrete visual and tactile examples of central lesson concepts.

Recycle Interactive Exhibits

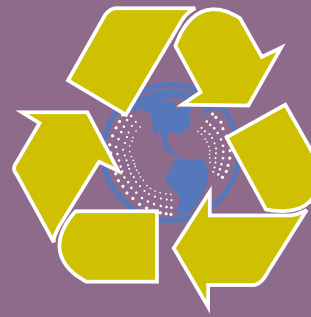
The S.C.R.A.P. Gallery provides a link between industry, education, the arts and the environment through its exhibits featuring hands-on exploration and communicative interpretations.

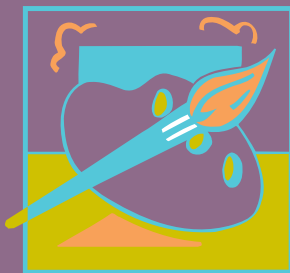

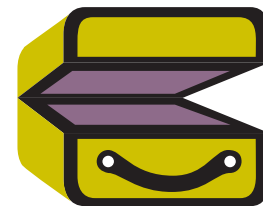
Trash Can Curriculum
