CHAPTER 5.33 OF THE CATHEDRAL CITY MUNICIPAL CODE PROVIDES THAT THE CITY MANAGER OR DESIGNEE MAY ISSUE A TEMPORARY MASSAGE THERAPIST PERMIT TO ANY PERSON WHO POSSESSES A VALID MASSAGE THERAPIST PERMIT ISSUED BY ANY OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY WITH REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE SIMILAR TO CATHEDRAL CITY'S, INCLUDING THE TRAINING, PHYSICAL CLEARANCE, FINGERPRINTING AND BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION REQUIREMENTS.

CHAPTER 5.33 OF THE CATHEDRAL CITY MUNICIPAL CODE REQUIRES THAT AN APPLICANT FOR A TEMPORARY MASSAGE THERAPIST PERMIT SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTATION WITH THE FOREGOING APPLICATION:

- A. A CERTIFIED COPY OF A VALID MASSAGE THERAPIST PERMIT ISSUED BY ANOTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY;
- B. A CERTIFIED COPY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE OR OTHER LAW PURSUANT TO WHICH THE FOREGOING PERMIT WAS ISSUED;
- C. PROOF OF IDENTIFICATION; AND
- D. A NONREFUNDABLE APPLICATION DEPOSIT FEE OF TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00).

CHAPTER 5.33 OF THE CATHEDRAL CITY MUNICIPAL CODE REQUIRES THAT AN APPLICANT FOR A TEMPORARY PERMIT PROVIDE A STATEMENT, UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY, OF THE JUSTIFICATION FOR THE PERMIT.

I AM REQUESTING A TEMPORARY MASSAGE THERAPIST PERMIT FOR THE FOLLOWING REASON(S):

I DECLARE UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY UNDER THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA THAT THE FOREGOING IS TRUE AND CORRECT.

ALL TEMPORARY PERMITS SHALL AUTOMATICALLY EXPIRE THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF ISSUANCE UNLESS OTHERWISE EXTENDED BY THE CITY MANAGER. THE CITY MANAGER IS VESTED WITH THE DISCRETION TO EXTEND THE TERM OF A TEMPORARY PERMIT FOR AN ADDITIONAL THIRTY DAYS PROVIDED THAT NO PERMIT TERM SHALL EXCEED A TOTAL OF NINETY DAYS.

THE CITY MANAGER ALSO HAS THE DISCRETION TO CONDITION THE ISSUANCE OF A TEMPORARY MASSAGE THERAPIST PERMIT ON ANY ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT THAT HE OR SHE DEEMS NECESSARY TO ASSURE THAT THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH PERMIT IS CONSISTENT WITH THE PURPOSE AND INTENT OF CHAPTER 5.33 OF THE CATHEDRAL CITY MUNICIPAL CODE.

Temporary Massage Therapist Permit

A. Applicant Requirements

- Must complete Temporary Permit application
- Must provide the following:
 - certified copy of a valid permit issued by an approved governmental entity¹
 - certified copy of ordinance or law pursuant to which the above-referenced permit was issued
 - proof of identification
 - nonrefundable application deposit fee of \$25.00

B. Conditions

- City Manager may issue permit upon a finding of good cause therefor
- Permit expires 30 days after issuance
 - City Manager may approve up to two 30-day permit extensions
- City Manager may condition permit on any additional requirements necessary to assure the purpose and intent of ordinance is satisfied

C. Fees

- \$25.00 nonrefundable application deposit

D. Processing

- Application for endorsement must be date stamped on the date received.
- Within 30 days of receipt of application, applicant must be notified that application is complete or incomplete.
- Upon verification that application is complete, investigation to be conducted to determine the accuracy of the information contained in the application and compliance with all applicable regulations. The City Manager or his or her designee is to determine the necessity and scope of the review and investigation. Findings of the investigation must be made in writing.

¹ An approved governmental entity is one which has massage therapist permit requirements similar to the City's, including therapist training, physical clearance, fingerprinting and background investigation. The City Manager or his or her designee may determine whether the requirements of another governmental entity are sufficiently similar to the City's to satisfy the City's permit requirements.

- Ordinance does not provide a time within which a decision to grant or deny a permit must be made; however, it is reasonable that such a decision could be made within 30 days of receipt of a completed application.

E. Grounds for Denial

- City Manager may deny application for permit upon a finding that there is insufficient good cause for the permit to issue
